Reminder: Start and end of the day procedures

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2

- Children should be brought on to the infant yard between <u>8.40am 8.50am</u> where a senior member of staff will be waiting to admit them to the building. Doors will close at 8.50am.
- All classes will be dismissed on to the infant yard at 3.20pm.

Year 3 - Year 6

- Children should be brought to the main gates between <u>8.40am 8.55am</u> where a senior member of staff will be waiting to admit them to the building. Gates will close at 8.55am.
- Year 3 and Year 4 will be dismissed on to the Key Stage 2 yard at 3.25pm
- Year 5 and Year 6 will be dismissed on to the Key Stage 2 yard at 3.30pm

Arriving Late to School?

An adult must accompany children to the main reception area; children should then be signed into school via the reception iPad which is situated at the reception window.





















If you are a member of the Armed Services, you will probably already know all about the government's funding scheme - Service Children Pupil Premium. The additional funding aims to help schools provide a support system for service children, who often must move school regularly or deal with separation from a parent serving overseas. For schools to secure the right funding to support pupils, we must have correct information recorded for your child. Therefore, can you please let us know if either parent/carer is a current serving member of the Armed Services.

In addition, the DFE makes additional funds available for students who have been adopted from care. You are under no obligation to provide us with this information, however, if you wish to discuss this any further, please contact us to make an appointment to meet myself or Miss West, Deputy Headteacher. Please remember if your financial circumstances change even for a short while you may be entitled to benefits related free school meals, these currently stay with your child, under the current regulations, for the rest of their school days and schools can also provide support with the likes of breakfast clubs, after school clubs and trips too. Attendance Guide for Parents/Carers

What YOU must do:

- Telephone the school before 9am each day of your child's absence.
- Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.
- If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.
- Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour, or friend.
- If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance, then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

- Check your child's attendance every day.
- Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.
- Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.
- If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.

Home Learning

Home learning is a very important part of a child's education and can add much to a child's development. We recognise that the educational experience that any school by itself can provide is limited by the time and resources available; children can therefore benefit greatly from the complementary learning that they do at home. Parents and carers have a vital role to play in their child's education, and home learning is an important part of this process. We ask parents and carers to encourage their child to complete the home learning tasks that are set on e-schools each Friday and are to be completed by the following Thursday.

Please note clubs are a one-off payment, no refunds will be given for non-attendance, if your child decides they do not like the club they have been signed up for and wants to swop, that may not be possible if other clubs are at full capacity, please ask and we can let you know.

Once google forms and club payment reports have been ran, Miss Tindale/PE Lead will then send a confirmation text to all parents/carers to reconfirm the chosen club, via an eSchools text next Friday 13th by midday. Google forms have been sent via text and via Marvellous me today.

Online Payments

How to set up online payments for trips, meals or events etc

How to create an account:

- To register go to the login screen on the App/Web. If using the web version of School Gateway, ensure the NEW USER tab is selected before inputting any details
- https://www.parentpay.com/schoolcomms/
- Enter the email address and mobile number that is registered with the school.
- A PIN will be sent on a text.
- Enter the 4-digit PIN number received via text.
- Once logged in the home screen will be displayed.

If already registered

- Access as an existing user
- Enter the email that is registered with the school and your existing PIN
- Once logged in the home screen will be displayed.

If you have forgotten your PIN

- On the login screen click on Forgotten PIN
- Enter the email address and mobile number that is registered with the school.
- A PIN will be sent on a text.
- Enter the 4-digit PIN number received via text.
- Once logged in the home screen will be displayed.
