

Earrings Reminder

As of Monday 15th September, if your child comes to school wearing earrings and cannot remove them independently, you will be contacted and asked to come to school to remove, for them.

Earrings can pose a risk of injury, particularly during physical activities, sports, and even in the classroom.

We understand that earrings are a form of personal expression, and respect that. However, they are not part of our uniform, our priority is to ensure a safe environment for everyone. We ask that children refrain from wearing any earrings to school. This includes clear plastic studs.

Pupils should not wear jewellery to school unless by exceptional agreement of the Governing Body due to religious grounds. Only one wristwatch is permitted; to keep all our children safe we have a no smart watch policy. We also ask that children do not come to school wearing false nails or make up and advise against nail varnish.

If your child wears earrings to school, they will not be able to participate in:

- PE lessons
- Active games such as football at playtimes
- Climbing/playing outdoors at breaks
- Active after school clubs which commence week 15th

We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring a safe and healthy learning environment for all. Thank you for your understanding and support.

Toileting support for children and education settings


