

What Are Autism Hubs?

Gateshead Autism Hubs offer parents and carers of autistic children and young people (0-25 years) information, advice and support on a range of challenges that can impact autistic young people and their families. The Hubs provide multi-agency drop-in sessions, parent support groups, and training for parents, carers, and professionals. The Hubs can also offer information and signposting on related cooccurring conditions, such as: FASD, ADHD, Sensory Differences, Social and Communication Differences, Mental Health, and Learning Disabilities. Gateshead Autism Hubs are free to access for parents and carers. An autism diagnosis is not required to access support.

Support Available?

The Hubs provide a range of parent / carer support sessions including multi agency drop-ins, peer support groups and learning opportunities across Gateshead.
